



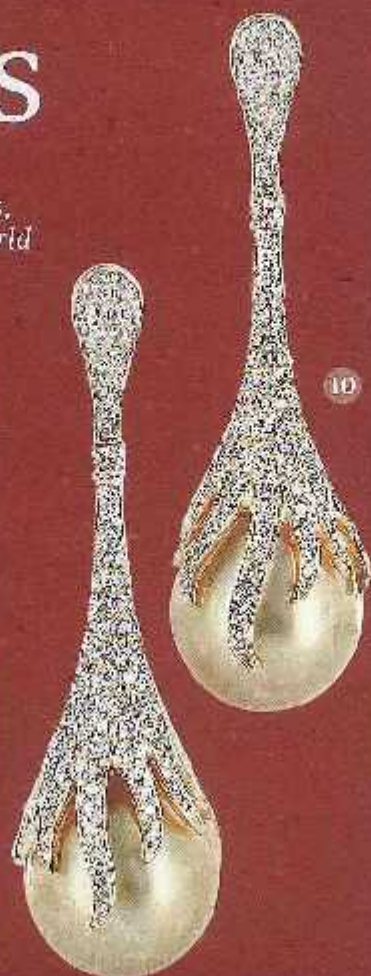
Sheer lengths

Few items are more feminine than seductively long earrings, which rank among the most avidly sought stars at Baselworld

This is a trend that's certain to raise the pulse rates of style-savvy women. Long, elaborately crafted pendant earrings, similar to those that dangle from the earlobes of Hollywood actresses who sashay along red carpets at posh events around the world, are absolutely en vogue for jewellery enthusiasts this coming season. These feminine pieces often consist of several flexible, connected elements that swing and sway to attract admiring attention with each motion of the wearer's head. The spectrum of materials used for this trend is as great as the diversity of shapes. For ex-

ample, jewellery brand Hesse combines diamonds and South Sea pearls to create elegant organically shaped pendant earrings, while de Grisogoni's Tubetto collection alternates gemstone-set, polished gold surfaces and coloured gemstones to produce glittering effects at the ear. Delicately feminine pieces from Liza Belotserkivskaya Jewellery make a bold statement despite a minimalist silhouette of two stylised star-shaped elements. In contrast to this pared back approach, designer Christina Debs lets artistically crafted spiders and other animal creatures crawl across her vividly coloured jewellery for the ears.
